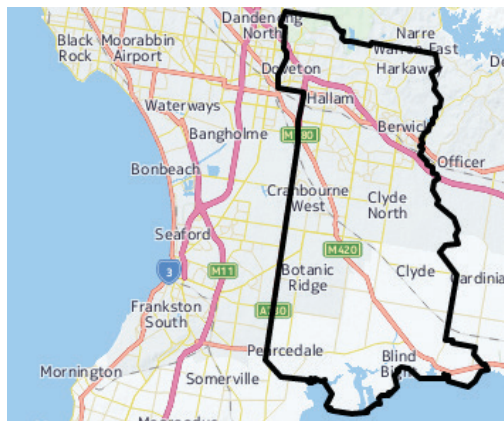

CITY OF CASEY

The City of Casey is located in Melbourne's south-eastern suburbs, between 28 and 60 kilometres south-east of the Melbourne GPO.

The City of Casey is a rapidly developing residential area, with large areas of land still allocated for urban development, and surrounding rural areas. The City of Casey encompasses a total land area of about 400 square kilometres. Rural land is used mainly for grazing, horse agistment, market gardening, flower growing and open space/parklands.

Current population is approximately 300,000 predicted to increase to over 500,000 by 2041¹.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Growing Suburbs Fund will help the City of Casey deliver the following facilities in the Hunt Club Estate:

- A district level AFL/Cricket facility with one new oval
- Cricket nets
- An expanded pavilion with community meeting space, and unisex and accessible bathrooms
- Floodlighting; and
- A path network, play space, car parking and landscaping.

This project will improve access for the Cranbourne East community to sporting and recreational facilities.

Expected completion: Mid 2019

Growing Suburbs Fund: \$2,381,371
