Hume has a high level of cultural diversity with nearly 30% born in a non-English speaking country and more than 40% speaking a language other than English at home.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Growing Suburbs Fund will help Hume City Council deliver the Hume Global Learning Centre next to the site of the existing library in Sunbury.

This major project will provide a new state-of-the-art facility that will prepare the community for the digital future and recreate the library as a genuine meeting space that promotes life-long learning.

The centre will include:

- A state-of-the-art digital library
- A technology and equipment hub
- Flexible, multi-purpose community meeting spaces
- Meeting/interview rooms
- Hume Multiversity computer and training space
- Conference facilities including a commercial kitchen
- Business incubation and co-working spaces
- A cultural space
- Council customer services; and
- Car parking, landscaping and an outdoor courtyard.
