The Growing Suburbs Fund is a contribution towards meeting critical local infrastructure needs for communities in Melbourne's diverse and fast-growing outer suburbs. It is positioned to quickly respond to the pressures being experienced by interface communities by bringing forward local infrastructure projects that will make a big difference in the day-to-day lives of outer suburban families.



Nillumbik Shire Council is located 25 km North-east of the Melbourne Central Business District, and the southern boundary is the Yarra River. It is predominantly urban to the South while the north of the municipality includes significant features like the Kinglake National Park and Sugarloaf Reservoir. In 2017, Nillumbik Shire recorded an annual resident population growth rate of 0.7 per cent, of 65,000 residents¹.

The population is forecasted to grow to 68,000, by 4 per cent, by 2031.

ELTHAM NORTH ADVENUTRE PLAYGROUND ENHANCEMENT

Background: The Growing Suburbs Fund will partner with Nillumbik Shire Council to enhance the Eltham North Adventure Playground with the installation of play, picnic, amenity plantings and circulation infrastructure at the Eltham North. Perimeter play elements that connect the play space with the adjoining natural landscape environments will allow for calm, reflective play away from the energy of the main play space. Elements will include

- a dry creek bed
- interactive water features
- picnic shelters, BBQs, tables and drinking taps
- perimeter pathways
- landscaping
- car park enhancements asphalting disabled car parking bay, line marking, bollards, upgrading car park surface
- signage
- interactive public art installation




Figure 1 – Location of the Project site and Project zones
