### TRUCK CURFEWS LIFTED UNTIL 10 JUNE 2021

The Victorian Government has extended the removal of truck curfews to support deliveries to Victorian pharmacies and supermarkets during the current COVID-19 circuit breaker restrictions.

The truck curfew exemption has been extended across the state by seven days from 11:59pm 3 June to 11:59pm 10 June 2021.

The lifted truck curfews support quicker deliveries to Victorian pharmacies and supermarkets during the current COVID-19 circuit breaker restrictions.

Greater flexibility is required in scheduling driver deliveries outside of normal operating hours so that supermarkets and pharmacies can meet an increased demand for essential goods.

Heavy vehicles can pass time-based curfew "no trucks" signs when making grocery deliveries to supermarkets or personal hygiene products to retail outlets.
