The City of Casey is located in Melbourne's south-eastern suburbs, between 28 and 60 kilometres southeast of the Melbourne GPO.

The City of Casey is a rapidly developing residential area, with large areas of land still allocated for urban development, and surrounding rural areas. The City of Casey encompasses a total land area of about 400 square kilometres. Rural land is used mainly for grazing, horse agistment, market gardening, flower growing and open space/parklands.

Current population is approximately 300,000 predicted to increase to over 500,000 by 2041<sup>1</sup>.
