

Mornington Peninsula Shire

The Growing Suburbs Fund is a contribution towards meeting critical local infrastructure needs for communities in Melbourne's diverse and fast-growing outer suburbs. It is positioned to quickly respond to the pressures being experienced by interface communities by bringing forward local infrastructure projects that will make a big difference in the day-to-day lives of outer suburban families.



The Mornington Peninsula Shire is situated on a promontory located more than 40 km to the south east of Melbourne, with more than 190 km of coastal boundaries. It is characterised by a mix of urban areas, resort towns, tourist developments and rural land.

The Peninsula is one of the major holiday and retirement destinations for Melbournians. The northern areas of the Shire have experienced significant residential development with improved road access in recent years. In 2017, the Shire had an annual population growth rate of 1.4 per cent and its population is forecasted to grow from about 163,200 in 2017 to 182,000, representing an 11 per cent increase by 2031¹.

HASTINGS STREETScape RENEWAL

High Street, Queen Street and Marine Parade, Hastings VIC 3915

Project Description: The Growing Suburbs Fund will help Mornington Peninsula Shire deliver a more vibrant and attractive Hastings town centre, to improve the resilience and liveability of the local community and surrounding areas.

The Hastings Streetscape Renewal works will include:

- Redevelopment of High Street between Queen Street and Marine Parade, with wider footpaths, a dedicated off-road mobility/cycle path, new street furniture, lighting, landscaping and paving.
- Three parklets at key nodes
- Open spaces within High Street
- Upgrades to five laneways featuring local historical references
- Public toilets facility replacement.
