Golden Plains Shire Council

Golden Plains Shire is located in south-western Victoria, about 80-160 kilometres from the Melbourne CBD, 10-100 kilometres from the Geelong CBD, and 10-80 kilometres from the Ballarat CBD.

Known as one of Victoria's peri-urban councils, the current population of 23,722 is expected to grow to 33,073 by 2036.¹

ROSS CREEK PLAY & ACTIVE REC UPGRADE

The Growing Suburbs Fund will assist Golden Plains Shire Council to deliver a play space that will response to a critical gap in infrastructure for the Ross Creek/Smythes Creek townships.

This project will see an upgrade of the Ross Creek Play Space and active recreation infrastructure at the Ross Creek Recreation Reserve. It will include the installation of new play and fitness elements that meet Australian Standards, the provision of social infrastructure including a BBQ, street furniture and an extension of the existing trail network.
