

# Growing Suburbs Fund 2020-21 Round 2

The Growing Suburbs Fund is a contribution towards meeting critical local infrastructure needs for communities in Melbourne's diverse and fast-growing outer suburbs. It is positioned to quickly respond to the pressures being experienced by interface and peri-urban communities by bringing forward local infrastructure projects that will make a big difference in the day-to-day lives of outer suburban families.

## Whittlesea City Council



Whittlesea City Council is located about 20 km north of the Melbourne Central Business District. The southern parts of the city are established urban areas and current residential developments are extending towards the north of the municipality.

Whittlesea City Council is home to an ethnically diverse community, with more than half of the residents from non-English speaking backgrounds. In 2018, the population of Whittlesea City Council grew 3.5 per cent compared with the national average of 1.6 per cent. The population is projected to grow by 63.2 per cent from around 223,300 in 2018, to about 364,500 in 2036<sup>1</sup>.

## NORRIS BANK RESERVE WEST PRECINCT

128 McLeans Road Bundoora 3083

The Growing Suburbs Fund will assist Whittlesea City Council to redevelop the Norris Bank Reserve Western Precinct to form a multi-use youth space providing modern social amenities, and social and physical interaction opportunities.

The project will include:

- An upgraded main entrance pathway and a circulation path network to provide broader connection to the reserve
- A seating deck and performance space for small groups and impromptu events
- Bleacher seating inclusive of inset LED programmable lighting
- Multi use furniture and interactive lighting displays
- An irrigated north facing grass embankment
- A central irrigated passive recreation area
- A eucalyptus and banksia garden
- A youth space shelter inclusive of Wifi and speakers
- A central multi-use basketball court

**Expected date of commencement:** December 2021

**Expected date of completion:** May 2022

**Total Project Cost:** \$1,200,000

**Growing Suburbs Fund:** \$600,000
