# Growing Suburbs Fund 2022-23

The Growing Suburb Fund (GSF) is a \$425M contribution to support the delivery of high priority community infrastructure projects for Victoria's diverse and fast-growing outer suburbs. Designed to support the existing and future local infrastructure needs of Melbourne's interface and peri-urban communities, the GSF brings forward local infrastructure projects that are essential to the liveability of outer suburban families.

## Bass Coast Shire Council



Bass Coast Shire, located approximately 140km from Melbourne CBD, is a rural, residential and holiday area. The Shire encompasses a total land area of about 860 square kilometres, including substantial coastal areas. The major towns are Wonthaggi, Cowes, Inverloch, San Remo, and Grantville, with numerous smaller townships.

Known as one of Victoria's peri-urban councils, the area recorded a growth rate of 3.1% in 2019-20<sup>1</sup>. The current population of 37,445 is expected to grow to 48,145 or 28.6% by 2036<sup>2</sup>.

Victoria's population growth slowed during the pandemic period with the impact over this time mainly felt in the inner and middle suburbs of Melbourne; regional areas were less affected due to increased migration from Melbourne. Based on the latest available data, areas across Victoria are now expected to return to normal rates and patterns.

## Anderson Street Reserve San Remo

The Growing Suburbs Fund will assist Bass Coast Shire Council to deliver the greenfield site of the Anderson Street Reserve Master Plan to provide active and passive recreation needs of the growing San Remo community.

### The scope of the project includes:

- A playspace
- Universal fitness area
- Rotunda
- Plantings for shade
- Accessible parking
- A shared pathway network

Expected date of commencement: February 2024 Expected date of completion: September 2024

Total Project Cost: \$617,000 Growing Suburbs Fund: \$517,000 Other contributions:

Bass Coast Shire Council: \$100,000
