The Growing Suburbs Fund is a contribution towards meeting critical local infrastructure needs for communities in Melbourne's diverse and fast-growing outer suburbs. It is positioned to quickly respond to the pressures being experienced by interface communities by bringing forward local infrastructure projects that will make a big difference in the day-to-day lives of outer suburban families.



The City of Melton is located approximately 40 kilometres west of central Melbourne and is considered one of the fastest growing interface councils. In 2017, the City of Melton had a growth rate of 5 per cent compared with the national average growth of 1.6 per cent. It is anticipated that Melton's population will more than double between 2017 and 2041¹.

Strong residential growth is expected to continue, with a number of new suburbs such as Aintree, Fraser Rise and Hillside currently under development.

Background: The Growing Suburbs Fund will assist Melton City Council to deliver a true community space that will reduce social isolation by providing a space for residents of Taylors Hill can exercise, play and socialise. By enhancing the existing local open space facilities that will be accessible for all ages and providing new infrastructure will positively contribute to improved health and well-being within the Taylors Hill community.

This project will deliver the following:

- a shelter located in the heart of the reserve and within view of the street
- multiple seating points for respite and social interaction
- low impact outdoor gym equipment that weaves through the reserve
- provision of a basketball court
- landscaping, planting and pathways.
